Leaders will be committed to their own professional development and that of others to ensure a culture of excellence and improvement.

A refined balance of intentional teaching and open-ended play ensures we support our young children to develop creativity, curiosity, resilience and concentration.

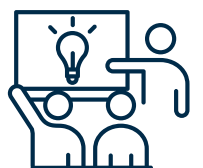
Expert Educators

- Develop strong assessment practices to track student progress and make data-informed decisions about teaching.
- Embed a framework for classroom observations, enabling all teachers to reflect on, refine and enhance their own practice.
- Work collaboratively with a shared and relentless focus on student progress, taking collective responsibility for all of our students.
- Support continuous improvement through high quality professional learning and coaching for all staff.

A learning environment where everyone belongs

The learning environment at Madora Bay Primary School will be welcoming, safe and inclusive. A strong sense of community will permeate our school as students, staff and families work together.

Meaningful and respectful relationships will underpin our culture with a strong focus on Positive Behaviour Support; a whole school framework characterised by proactive practices to define, teach and support appropriate student behaviour.

From the intersection of Mandurah Road and Banksiadale Gate, north along Mandurah Road (west side included) to the local government boundary between the City of Mandurah and the City of Rockingham, west along this local government boundary to the Indian Ocean coastline, south along the coastline to a point on the eastern extension of the east-west alignment of Abeona Parade, east to and along Abeona Parade (north side included) to Eleanore Drive, east along Eleanore Drive (north side included) to the intersection with Victor Drive, south east from this intersection through the bush area to Mandurah Road, and north along Mandurah Road (west side included) to the intersection with Banksiadale Gate.
